Dear Mr. Mihalco,

I have received your facsimile advising of the South Buxton Raceway 2009 Stock Car Racing Season Schedule to be held at your raceway in South Buxton, Ontario every Saturday night starting **May 16th, 2009 to September 26, 2009.**

I am pleased to advise you that the use of **Tariff Item 9993.00.00.00** is being extended to you for this event.

Goods imported temporarily under tariff item 9993.00.00.00 cannot be sold, leased or further manufactured or processed while in Canada. The goods must be imported in a reasonable quantity pertaining to their use while in Canada. The goods must be exported within a reasonable time after the conclusion of the event. Should participants decide to give away, sell or otherwise dispose of any temporarily imported goods, they must contact the nearest Canada Border Services Agency office or their Customs Broker to arrange for the proper accounting for those goods. After the event, any goods that remain in Canada are subject to the payment of duties and taxes regardless of whether or not the goods are sold.

Please be advised that the racing vehicles, trailers and conveyances for moving such vehicles into and from Canada, repair parts and repair equipment such as tires, wheels, spare parts, tools, portable shop equipment, etc. required to maintain the imported racing vehicles while in Canada, are permitted temporary entry under the Tariff Item. **The usual temporary entry documentation and security deposit requirements are hereby waived for the aforementioned goods.** Fuel in excess of the normal tank capacity of the racing vehicles, oil, grease, and other consumables are subject to payment of duties and taxes at time of importation into Canada. Listings of goods being imported should be prepared indicating description, quantity and values.

I recommend that participants coming to this event from outside of Canada, be provided with a copy of this letter for presentation to Canada Border Services Agency Officials at time of entry into Canada.

Similarly, participants may wish to register their goods with U.S. Customs in order to expedite their return to the U.S.A after the event.

This letter does not preclude the necessity for possession of appropriate documentation to satisfy Immigration requirements at time of arrival in Canada. Please visit www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/index.asp for more information or contact Immigration at 1-888-242-2100.
